"Some photographers have a uniform, recognizable style. To me, it seems limiting to only photograph the world in one way. I don't consider myself to be a traditional photographer. I like to look for something of interest to photograph and go beyond it to find a different way to portray the shot. Photography allows me to get outside the box, be a bit rebellious, break some rules and get away with it. Photography is also my way of slowing down, escaping the norm and watching the world move at a more peaceful pace. The day I discovered photography was the day I also discovered a hidden part of myself.

M-Y-N-D in Icelandic means photo or image. MYND'S i is the name of my photography business. I like that a photograph is made, not taken. It is made in your own mind and with your own eye, and it is slow and considered in its making.

Anyone can take a photo, but not everyone can make a picture. It takes a discerning eye, a sense of what is around you, and how everything is reacting to the surrounding light sources. Without light, photography would not exist. In fact light is the true subject of every photograph. My passion is to chase the light, searching for it in beautiful and interesting places, make pictures and to share them with others."

At our meeting, Ginny will be taking us through her journey as a photographer and will discuss some of her unique processes and techniques. Since she began showing her work, Ginny became a member of the Foyer Gallery, has participated in numerous studio tours (Red Trillium, Maple Run), has shown at Expressions of Art, and has had solo shows at the City of Ottawa's Atrium Gallery, and Alice's Café.
