Jo-Ann Zorzi, silk fiber artist

Jo-Ann has, from a young age, had a keen interest in art, but pursued her other love, science, as a career. When work travel became overwhelming, she decided that a change was called for and started exploring the creation of art. Happenstance led her to discover and fall in love with silk fiber. She is largely self-taught and through experimentation has developed her own techniques for working with this medium.

Her art is greatly influenced by her curious nature and her vivid imagination. She is fascinated by the unknown and unexplored. Her source of inspiration is both what she sees around her and what she imagines could be. The textural nature of silk allows her to explore and develop her art through her hands as well as her eyes.

Jo-Ann has exhibited in both Canada and the U.S. and is an active member of several arts organizations and groups. She is a member of "SOULPLAY", a group of five fiber artists with whom, she has been collectively exhibiting her works in various venues through the province.

During her presentation, Jo-Ann will present us with examples of her work as well as illustrate the techniques she has developed and uses for her art.
